

CURRENT SCHOLARSHIPS

Harvard University – FREE TUITION!!!! Harvard University has announced that from now on, undergraduate students from low-income families will pay no tuition. **If your family earns less than \$60,000 per year and you are an honor student graduating from high school in the Class of 2010, Harvard wants to pay your tuition!!** You still must apply and be admitted, so the same admission requirements apply – but if you are admitted and your family earns less than \$60,000, then you are eligible for this opportunity. CBC Spouses Flexible Education Scholarship (University of Phoenix) – This scholarship is administered through the Congressional Black Caucus Foundation (CBCF). 25 full-tuition scholarships will be awarded to students seeking an associate’s, bachelor’s, or master’s degree at the University of Phoenix (on-line or on campus). This mission of this program is to advance educational opportunities for underrepresented and non-traditional groups in higher education. Preference will be given to applicants who are economically disadvantaged and who have experienced hardships. Criteria: must be of Asian American descent; must be a full-time graduating high school senior in good academic standing; have a minimum GPA of 2.75; plan to attend an accredited college or vocational school; must be a U.S. citizen or a permanent resident of the U.S. Applicants will be evaluated on the basis of their scholastic and personal achievements, leadership, community involvement, work experience, a letter of recommendation, and personal essay. “Signs & More” Senior Scholarship – Scholarships will be awarded to 3 Cobb County graduating seniors. Each award will be at least \$100 in value. To qualify, you must plan to attend a 2- or 4-year college/university after high school graduation, and plan to major in a graphics arts-related field. Applications are available in the Counseling Office. **Deadline May 15, 2010.**

Wellstar Cobb Hospital Auxiliary Scholarship – Wellstar Cobb Hospital is proud to announce the 2010 Scholarship program. To be eligible, applicants must: pursue a degree in the healthcare profession; have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0; submit official proof of acceptance from the college you will be attending (must be in the state of Georgia). **If you are a recipient of the HOPE Scholarship or the HOPE Grant, you are NOT ELIGIBLE for the Wellstar Cobb Auxiliary Scholarship.** The winner will receive a \$2,250 scholarship, payable in 2 installments, to the college/university of their choice. **Deadline May 28, 2010.**
