Summer Academy for Future Teachers (AFT) @ GA State – The Academy for Future Teachers is designed for bright, talented, and diverse high school students seriously considering a career teaching math or science in an urban environment. Through the AFT, students collaborate with master teachers and university faculty, developing teaching and tutoring skills, participating in field trips, and building an appreciation for the value of professional and academic preparation. Math and science concepts are reinforced as participants practice presentation skills which they demonstrate as they teach fellow students. Teamwork and leadership skills are emphasized. The AFT is an intense three-week, five days a week (June 7-25, 2010) initiative held at Georgia State University from 8:30 am – 1:30 pm. The AFT is FREE to accepted students!! Teen Work Program – The Teen Work Program is funded through the federal stimulus dollars under the American Recovery & Reinvestment Act (ARRA) Initiative. The program will teach independence, reliability, and will impart work skills to the ext generation of Georgia workers. Teen Work will pay the students' wages directly (\$8.50 per hour) and these summer jobs will be available **June 1 – July 31, 2010**. The Accounting High School Residency Program @ UGA (ARP) – Since 1988, the Georgia Society of CPAs (GSCPA) and the University of Georgia have hosted the High School Residency Program. The 2010 program will take place at the University of Georgia on **June 27-30, 2010**. Students will stay in one of the residence halls, eat in campus dining halls, and attend accounting-related informational sessions throughout the day. The program fee is only \$50!
