STUDENT PARKING

Every student who drives on campus MUST purchase a parking decal. The parking decals are \$50 per semester and are sold in the Macland Office after school if not purchase in the cafeteria during designated days at the beginning of each semester. See the McEachern website for all parking rules, regulations, and forms needed to apply. Fines are issued for those parking without a permit and are charged \$1/day late fee. Vehicles are subject to be towed upon infractions.

LEAVING CAMPUS POLICY

Any student who leaves campus without properly checking out will receive disciplinary action and may lose his/her parking permit and driving privileges for at least 45 school days. *McEachern High School is a closed campus. Students must stay on the school grounds from the time they arrive, even if school has not started, until dismissal.* Any student leaving the school grounds must check out through the attendance office. Students may not go to the parking lot without prior written permission. This includes during lunch time.

NATIONAL COLLEGE FAIR

NACAC is hosting a national college fair on Sunday, February 12th from noon – 4pm at the Georgia World Congress Center in downtown Atlanta. Colleges will be set up in Exhibit Hall B. Over 200 colleges will be in attendance and a variety of parent/student workshops will be held. There is no cost for the fair or the sessions but students are encouraged to pre-register. Just enter your information and interests prior to the fair and receive a unique bar code to be used at the fairs. When you find a college you are interested in, simply have them scan your bar code and avoid filling out multiple information cards while at the fair.

HOPE SCHOLARSHIP

To be eligible for regular HOPE students must have a 3.0 HOPE GPA graduating from an eligible high school. They must maintain a 3.0 GPA in college to remain eligible to keep HOPE. The HOPE amount is capped at 90% of the 2010-2011 University of Georgia System tuition rate and does not include any tuition increases that may be implemented by the System. To be eligible for the Zell Miller Scholarship students must have a 3.7 HOPE GPA from an eligible high school and have a combined 1200 on the critical reading and math sections of the SAT or a 26 composite ACT score from a single test sitting. Students must maintain a 3.3 GPA in college to remain eligible for the Zell Miller Scholarship. This scholarship will cover 100% of tuition for an academic year. Students who drop below the college 3.3 GPA can earn regular HOPE if their GPA remains at a 3.0 or higher. For both regular HOPE and the Zell Miller Scholarship, book and fee allowances have been eliminated and remedial courses are NOT covered. Students who remain academically eligible may receive HOPE until they have attempted a maximum of 127 semester hours. Students who lose regular HOPE or the Zell Miller Scholarship will have a SINGLE chance to regain HOPE. Beginning with the class of 2015, students will be required to demonstrate that they have taken a certain number of rigorous high school courses in math, science and foreign language (which will include dual-enrollment courses in those areas).

SENIOR SCHOLARSHIPS

Betty Gray Scholarship

Foundation 2000 For Children is pleased to provide The Betty Gray Scholarship in the amount of \$1,500. Applicants must attend an accredited college or university (two-year or four-year) in Georgia, and must have at least a 3.0 Cumulative Grade Point Average on a 4.0 scale in order to qualify for the scholarship. Applications available in the BT Counseling Office in the Scholarship Drawer. Postmark deadline March 1, 2012.

Gates Millennium Scholars – The Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation presents its annual scholarship award for undergraduate and graduate students. This award is intended to identify outstanding students who have significant financial need and have demonstrated leadership skills. 1,000 talented students will be selected for the GMS scholarship based on the following eligibility criteria:

- You are African American, American Indian/Alaska Native, Asian Pacific Islander American, or Hispanic American
- You are a citizen, national, or legal permanent resident of the United States
- You have a cumulative unweighted GPA of 3.3 on a 4.0 scale
- You will be enrolling for the first time at a U.S. accredited college/university in the Fall of 2011
- You have demonstrated leadership abilities through participation in community service, extracurricular or other activities

You meet the Federal Pell Grant eligibility criteria (determined only through submission of a FAFSA)

This renewable, need-based scholarship provides financial support throughout the winner's undergraduate career and into graduate school for those who choose to study in one of the seven approved graduate disciplines. Interested students are strongly advised to have all parts of your application completed online. (If you must apply on paper, you may download and print the application). Go to www.gmsp.org to apply online and for additional information. Deadline January 11, 2012 at 11:59 p.m. EST for online applications – this is also the POSTMARK deadline for paper applications.

Delta Sigma Theta Sorority Scholarship – The Marietta-Roswell Alumnae Chapter of Delta Sigma Theta So-

rity, Inc. offers this annual scholarship program. Scholarships are awarded to young African-American women who exemplify academic excellence, strong leadership, and community involvement. Applicants must be African-American female graduating seniors who live or attend school in Cobb, Cherokee, or North Fulton County, have a minimum 3.0 GPA, and must attend an accredited college, university, or post-secondary institution in pursuit of a degree within one year of high school graduation. (Applicants are also encouraged to attend an image building workshop being held on February 18, 2012 – those in attendance will receive 10 bonus points!) BBB Student of Integrity Scholarship Program – Six scholarships of \$1,000 each will be awarded this year.
